Pray for Your City

Recently, I was ministering with the Fellowship of Christian Farmers at the Tulsa Farm show in Oklahoma. Now, if you are not familiar with Tulsa, Oklahoma, it has to be the buckle of the Bible Belt. Tulsa is full of good churches, ministry head quarters, intercessors, Bible colleges, Christian radio and television, and good Christian conferences and camp meetings. Because of this, the spiritual climate and atmosphere is clear and light. After witnessing in Tulsa for about 3 1/2 hours I realized that I wasn't tired and felt good. I believe it is because the demonic strongholds are not as strong in Tulsa as in other cities so there wasn't as much spiritual warfare.

When I was in Bible school, Dr. Cho, the pastor of the world's largest church in Seoul, Korea, spoke at the church where the Bible school was. He said something to the effect that when he ministers in Japan he has to pray 5 to 6 hours before he preaches because Japan has so few Christians and strong demonic strongholds. Before he preaches in S. Korea he has to pray 4 hours and he said that while in the U.S.A. because there is so much Christianity here compared to other countries, he only needs to pray 2 or 3 hours before preaching.

Tulsa has been so saturated with prayer and praise and the Word that it was easy to minister there. **We need to saturate our cities, states and nation with prayer and intercession.** That will drive away the oppression and powers of darkness that hover over them, the blinders will be taken off the spiritual eyes of the people and demonic strongholds will be pulled down. We need to pray that God will pour out His glory and power down on our cities so that multitudes will get saved, delivered and healed without any hindrances.
